Procedures & Accidental Fecal Release (AFR) Form

- 1) While in pool, all Campers must be able/willing to restrain discharges and evacuations of urine and feces at all times.
- 2) Campers who even **might** have fecal "accidents" in pool **MUST WEAR APPROVED WATER PROOF SWIM DIAPERS during ALL swim time**. Regular diapers are not allowed in pool.
- 3) If your child has diarrhea or has had diarrhea within the past 10 days, please let Camp Nugget staff know because your child **must stay out of the pool**.

Community & Pool Sharing Considerations

When a swimmer has an accidental fecal release (AFR) **it causes the pool to be closed** for proper disinfection and protection of the health and safety of swimmers. The CSULB pool is shared with many other camps, clubs, and groups that depend on CSULB for use of the pool. As you can imagine, frequent accidental fecal release incidents by Camp Nugget Campers can cause Camp Nugget to lose its right to share the CSULB pool.

Camp Nugget Pool Responsibilities

All individuals entering CSULB pool during Camp Nugget swim time must be completely continent 100% of the time. That is, all individuals entering CSULB pool during Camp Nugget swim time must be **able and willing** to restrain discharges and evacuations of urine and feces at all times.

Water Proof Swim Diaper

If you child has an accidental fecal release (AFR), you will be required to provide approved water proof swim diaper (regular diapers are not allowed in pool) during all swim times.

We understand that accidents can happen, it is important we work together. We have and will continue to encourage children to use the rest room before going to the pool. If you your child has a 1-1 support person please make him or her aware of this information.

Camp Nugget attendees who:

- Wear diapers
- Are not COMPLETELY potty trained
- Are incontinent
- Have occasional accidents
- Or, for any reason are not **able and/or willing** to restrain discharges and evacuations of urine and feces at all times

MUST WEAR WATER PROOF SWIM DIAPERS. No exceptions!
