The 60th International Collegiate Business Strategy Competition Spring 2024 -- CBA 485 and GBA 685 Important Information and Application

Overview of the Competition

For 59 years, colleges from the United States and around the world have entered undergraduate and graduate business teams into the International Collegiate Business Strategy Competition (ICBSC) which runs only in the spring. Each team takes over the management of a manufacturing company competing directly against 4-5 other firms in its simulated "World." The team assumes responsibility for key strategic and operational decisions in marketing, finance, human resources and operations. Eight quarters of historical data are provided as the starting position wherein all teams are identical; then 20 sets of quarterly decisions are submitted by the teams for company operations over a simulated period of five years. Each team is responsible for a strategic business plan, an annual report, and one formal oral presentation to judges (who serve as the simulated companies' Board of Directors). Team members get the experience of running their own company and learning first-hand how a group effort can result in synergy and enthusiasm. Student Benefits

Each year students say that the competition has been the most rewarding experience of their college career. Some have said the greatest benefit was the realistic opportunity to apply academic concepts that are integrated across all business disciplines; others said the greatest benefit was being an integral part of a closely knit, finely honed team. Students listing the competition on their resume have discovered that it has helped them land a job or a valuable internship. Some have even benefited from interviewing with a person that had earlier participated in the competition as a judge or team member. Benefits include:

- 1. Hands-on experience of actually "running" a corporation
- 2. Bringing together functional academic concepts resulting in an integrated, applied management experience
- 3. The taste of battle with, at times, stirring success, or, at times, stunning failure--at least in the perspective of the moment
- 4. Feeling the synergy of the team experience
- 5. Earn three units of elective credit
- 6. "The single most rewarding experience in my entire college career." (quote from former student participant)
- 7. Become part of the CSULB winning tradition and an alum of the competition family
- 8. Great resume builder!

Who Should Apply?

Acceptance to be on a team is through application. The best candidates will be those CSULB undergraduate students who have completed their core coursework. Undergraduate students should have completed IS 301, MKT 300, MGMT 300, and Acct 201 before applying, usually juniors and seniors. MBA/Masters students should have completed enough units to be in their second year of the program. In some cases, first year master's students with undergraduate business degrees or extensive business work experience can be qualified.

- CSULB usually enters 3 teams of 4-6 members on each team. It can be 2 or 3 undergraduate teams and 2 or 3 MBA teams. The number of teams and members on a team depend on the mix and qualifications of the applicants. Generally, we are looking for 14-18 qualified students.
- While no specific GPA is required, students who have earned at least a GPA of 3.0 if an undergraduate and a 3.3 if a master's student are most likely to succeed.
- Students who like a challenge, are problem-solvers, like to learn and are not afraid to get out of their comfort zone are a good fit for the competition.
- Students who and have a flexible enough schedule that will allow them to meet on weekends or other times with their team members are especially encouraged to apply. The competition is time-consuming. Expect to spend between 4-10 hours outside of class each week working with your team. Good writing, analytical, presentation and computer skills, including the ability to use Excel or other spreadsheets are skills essential to being successful in the competition.

Application Process

To apply, students need to submit the one-page application form that is attached to this information document along with a personal statement.

The deadline to apply to be on a team is:

- October 21, 2023, by 5:00 PM
- Notifications NLT October 30, 2023

Competition Class Schedule and Key/Required Dates

The course schedule will follow the competition – not that of a regular semester. The tentative schedule for participation in the competition is as follows:

- Friday December 8, 2023, at 7pm. Required orientation meeting. There will be an overview of the upcoming competition, a discussion of materials, and information about getting prepared for the competition. Teams will be formed, and roles selected.
- After the December meeting, individuals will prepare by reading the simulation Player's Manual and learning how the simulation works. You will meet with your team members to organize and plan for practice sessions.
- Monday January 22, 2024, is the first "official" class session. Class meets on Monday evenings at 7:00 PM. It will be offered as a Hybrid course with most of the sessions being online. Three classes are in-person, not including the Intensive Phase.

In-person class dates (unlikely but subject to change depending on class progress)

- January 22
- February 12
- February 26
- March 18
- April 10
- The Intensive Phase will be April 18-20. You must be available the entire time from Thursday afternoon through Saturday late afternoon In-Person
- Following the competition, students will write a personal two-page paper on what they learned from the competition. The course ends at the end of the Intensive Phase and once the student reflection paper and second peer review is submitted.

Students are required to pay normal student fees associated with registering in a course at CSULB. The University will cover the competition application fees and hotel expenses in April.
