SUBJECT: Interpretation of 4.b in policy on Non-Traditional Grading

The provisions of 4.b in the Policy on Non-traditional Grading shall be understood to apply to minor, certificate, credential, option and concentration programs as well as to major programs.

This means that a department or interdepartmental program may declare any or all courses required for its major, minor, certificate, credential, or concentration to be unavailable on a CR/NC basis to students pursuing that specific major, minor, certificate, credential or concentration.
