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 CHOICE OF TEXTBOOKS AND FACULTY RESPONSIBILITY

CHOICE OF TEXTBOOKS AND FACULTY RESPONSIBILITY ON MULTI-SECTION AND SEQUENTIAL COURSES

- The following policy statement, recommended by the Academic Senate at its meeting of
 January 25, 1979, and approved by the President on March 8, 1979, is as follows:
- 9 I. The choice of textbook for a course is the professional responsibility of the faculty10 member teaching the course. Therefore, the following policy applies:
- A. It is the responsibility of the faculty member teaching a course to choose the textbook(s)for the course.
- 13 B. By vote of the faculty, departments may adopt a policy that requires use of the same
- 14 text(s) (or one of a small number of designated texts) for all sections of a multiple-section
- 15 course or all semesters of a sequential course. Where such a policy is in effect, the faculty
- 16 members who teach the course(s) are jointly responsible for making the selection.
- II. Departments have responsibility for course content, for assuring continuity in sequentialcourses, and for assuring that multiple sections of a course are similar in content and levelof instruction.
- 20 A. An appropriate body in each department offering sequential and/or multiple-section
- 21 courses shall meet each year to review syllabi or equivalent materials used by instructors in
- 22 multiple-section and sequential courses and to advise them if there are inappropriately wide
- variances in content, continuity, and levels of instruction between their courses and the
- 24 departmental course outlines

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- 25 B. An appropriate body for purposes of this policy shall be the department curriculum
- committee, an ad hoc committee consisting of those teaching the course, a course
- coordinator, or such other body as may be approved by the department.
