**INSTRUCTION IN THE MISSION, HISTORY, AND STRUCTURE OF AMERICAN
UNIVERSITIES AS A CONDITION FOR GRADUATION (UNIVERSITY 100)**

This policy, approved in 1979, was amended on April 30, 1984 and again on October 5, 1989. The President concurred with the second amendment on October 17, 1989.

To qualify for graduation, all undergraduate students who enter with fewer than 56 transferable semester units shall complete a one-unit course which includes instruction on the following topics: (a) history, missions, and structures of American universities; (b) use of the University Library; and (c) career planning. This course shall be completed during the first or second semester in which a student enrolls for more than six units of coursework.

Periodic review of this course will be the responsibility of the Planning and Educational Policies Council. The Council will conduct its initial review of the course during the 1984-85 academic year.

This amended policy statement was recommended by the Academic Senate at its meeting of March 29, 1984, and the President concurred on April 30, 1984.

SUBJECT: INSTRUCTION IN THE MISSION, HISTORY, AND STRUCTURE OF
AMERICAN UNIVERSITIES AS A CONDITION FOR GRADUATION
(UNIVERSITY 100)

To qualify for graduation, all undergraduate students who enter the University in the fall semester 1982 or thereafter with 59 or fewer transferable college semester units shall complete a one-unit course which includes instruction on the following topics: (a) history, missions, and structures of American universities; (b) use of the University Library; and (c) career planning. This course shall be completed during the first or second semester in which a student enrolls for more than six units of coursework.

Periodic review of this course will be the responsibility of the Planning and Educational Policies Council. The Council will conduct its initial review of the course during the 1984-85 academic year.

EFFECTIVE: Immediately

Parliamentary Note: The amended document contains the additional, underlined phrase in paragraph one. Paragraph two is amended to omit references to the development of the course.

The following policy statement, recommended by the Academic Senate at its meeting of May 21, 1979, and approved by the President on June 20, 1979, is as follows:

To qualify for graduation, all undergraduate students shall complete a one-unit course which includes instruction on the following topics: (a) history, missions and structures of American universities, (b) use of the University library, and (c) career planning. This course should be completed during the first or second semester in which a student enrolls for more than six units of coursework.

The Procedures for developing this course and the subsequent review and approval of the course will be the responsibility of the Planning and Educational Policies Council subject to Financial Affairs Council review and approval of the final detailed proposal.

The Planning and Educational Policies Council will evaluate this course no later than four years after its initial offering.
