Bachelor of Arts in Spanish Option II: Interdisciplinary Studies (120 units)

This new state-supported program was recommended by the Academic Senate on April 6, 2018 and concurred by the President on April 10, 2018.

Program Description

The Spanish Program offers courses in language, linguistics, literature, culture and translation leading to the following degrees and certificates: Bachelor of Arts with two options and Master of Arts degrees in Spanish, Single Subject Teaching Credential in Spanish, Concentration in Spanish for the Bachelor of Arts in Liberal Studies, minor in Spanish, and the Bilingual Concentration for B.A. in Liberal Studies.

Major Specific Unit Requirements:

Prerequisites

0-12 units of lower-division language courses depending on the student's existing and demonstrated language proficiency in Spanish.

Upper-Division

Take the following upper-division courses:

SPAN 300 Advanced Grammar and Composition (6)

Prerequisites: AP exam with a score of 4 or 5 or SPAN 201B or equivalent for non-native speakers. SPAN 250 or equivalent for heritage speakers

SPAN 310 Introduction to Literary Analysis (3)

Prerequisite: SPAN 300

SPAN 330 Literary Masterpieces: Spain (3)

Prerequisites: SPAN 310 or consent of instructor. GE Foundation requirements

SPAN 341 Literary Masterpieces: Spanish America (3)

Prerequisites: SPAN 310 or consent of instructor.

Take one course from the following:

SPAN 423 Introduction to Spanish Linguistics (3)

Prerequisite: SPAN 300 or consent of instructor.

SPAN 427 Contrastive Analysis of Spanish and English (3)

Prerequisites: One course in Spanish linguistics or consent of instructor.

Take one course from the following:

SPAN 430 Spanish Civilization (3)

Prerequisite: SPAN 300.

SPAN 445 Latin American Civilization (3)

Prerequisite/Corequisite: SPAN 300.

Take one upper-division course selected from the following for a total of 3 units:
