SUBJECT: Consortium Bachelor of Arts Degree in Russian

The BA in Russian is offered by a consortium of California State University and Colleges campuses in the Los Angeles area. Besides CSULB, CSULA, CSU Northridge, CSU Fullerton, and CSC San Bernardino participate. Students enrolling at CSULB and choosing to make this their home campus (i.e., the campus granting their degree) will be advised by a faculty member on this campus. At least 15 of the upper division courses in the major must be completed at CSULB: 9 units or more must be taken at one or several other campuses of the consortium. Students taking courses on several campuses during the same term or semester will pay fees at only one campus based upon total units undertaken. The Schedule of Classes at each campus will show courses available on other campuses of the consortium and a three-year cycle list of all required (core) courses will be available at the office of the faculty advisor. Registration in any course offered by the consortium can be arranged for a student by the home campus.

Major in Russian for the Bachelor of Arts Degree

Lower Division: A minimum 16 semester units (or the equivalent), of which at least 13 must be Russian language courses. If the requirement is met at this University, the student will take:

RUS 101A-B Fundamentals of Russian (4,4)

RUS 201A-B Intermediate Russian (4,4)

Upper Division: A minimum of 30 units including: 18 semester units or its equivalent in Russian language courses of which at least 9 semester units must be in Area A (Languages and Linguistics including a 3-unit linguistics course) and at least 9 semester units must be in Area B (Literature and Civilization - of which at least 6 units must be literature.) The remaining units are approved electives of which 9 units may be courses other than Russian language courses.
