Who is Martin Luther King Jr.?

Dr. Martin Luther King was a central figure in the Civil Rights Movement, where he sought equality for all regardless of race, creed, or religion through the means of nonviolent, civil disobedience. He served as a symbol of hope, particularly for the African American community, and was a published author and distinguished speaker, notably giving his "I Have a Dream" speech at the March on Washington. Dr. King was born on January 15, 1929, in Atlanta. He completed his undergraduate degree at Morehouse College before earning his Ph.D. in Systematic Theology at Boston University. At the age of 35, he was the youngest recipient of the Nobel Peace Prize and was also honored with the Congressional Gold Medal and the Presidential Medal of Freedom. Dr. King was assassinated on April 4, 1968, in Memphis. His birthday is a federal holiday, observed annually on the third Monday in January.
