## Who is Princess Ka'iulani?

Born in Honolulu in 1875, Victoria Kawēkiu Ka'iulani Lunalilo Kalaninuiāhiālapalapa Cleghorn, known as Princess Ka'iulani, was the Crown Princess and heir to the throne of Hawaii. She was a teenager when a group of businessmen from the United States forced her aunt, Queen Lili'uokalani, to abdicate her throne. In response, Princess Ka'iulani sailed to the United States and met with President Grover Cleveland to advocate for her nation's sovereignty. She convinced President Cleveland to challenge the colonial overthrow of the indigenous Hawaiian monarchy, which ultimately proved unsuccessful when his successor, President William McKinley, and Congress supported the conquest of Hawaii. Before she passed away on March 6, 1899, at the age of 23, Ka'iulani worked to gain voting rights for Native Hawaiians. She is remembered as an advocate for her people and for utilizing her voice to strengthen her homeland.
