CONSIDER A MOVE TO THE BEACH

Living on campus could be the best move you'll ever make. In fact, nearly 2,500 students call CSULB home. According to an American Council on Education study and recent university research, students who live on campus have a better chance of succeeding in college than students living off campus. In all categories of the survey, CSULB residents had higher grade point averages than CSULB commuters.

Living on campus contributes to academic success. It allows easy access to campus resources such as the libraries, classrooms, computer labs and recreational facilities. Since students don't have to worry about driving, parking or cooking, they have more time to study, socialize, work and exercise.

Because of the many proven benefits, all first-time freshmen are required (as space is available) to live in university housing unless they are over 21 years of age, or if they will be living home with a parent or legal guardian during their entire freshmen year.

By living in a residence hall you'll have the opportunity to meet people, make friends and have fun. You will become part of a community of students with similar lifestyles and meet people with whom you can share your experiences.

DESCRIPTION OF HALLS

CSULB has 18 on-campus residence halls, and two off-campus buildings that accommodate nearly 2,500 students. With the exception of a limited number of single accommodations, the majority of rooms are intended for double occupancy. All halls are co-ed. Students are assigned same sex roommates and restrooms. CSULB custodial staff maintain restrooms and public areas. The residence halls are served by central offices for mail, messages and general information.

HILLSIDE COLLEGE

This complex includes six two-story carpeted residence halls utilizing a self-contained suite design. A suite is a cluster of six rooms, one single and five double rooms which share a study room and two restrooms. All six of the buildings are co-ed with self-contained, separate lockable suites for men and women located across the corridors from each other. A study room in each suite includes a small sink, microwave and refrigerator. Each building has a common lounge where students can meet, complete with fireplace and a standard size TV.

LOS ALAMITOS & LOS CERRITOS

Los Alamitos and Los Cerritos are the two traditional-style residence halls closest to upper campus. These air-conditioned, three-story buildings house 204 students on separate floors and/or wings for men and women. On each wing, students share a common restroom and shower facilities. The halls provide a large, comfortable lounge, recreation room with large screen TV and study rooms. Most residents find that the traditional design significantly enhances their opportunity to get acquainted with one another.

INTERNATIONAL HOUSE

This particular house offers a unique opportunity in both living and international understanding. Utilizing a modern lodge design, the two-story hall includes double rooms in a two or three room suite design with a shared restroom. All of the suites are open to one of two spacious lounges and adjoining libraries where many international programs are hosted during the year. Here, every effort is made to pair American students with international students as roommates.

PARKSIDE COLLEGE

This complex has a carpeted suite design. All the suites include seven double rooms with a large restroom accessible from either side of the suite. All the buildings are co-ed; suites are self-contained and house only members of the same sex. The nine two-story buildings in the Parkside College are bordered on one side by a municipal park. Each Parkside building also shares a central lounge with a flat panel TV. Parkside College is home to nine of our Faculty in Residence who are available to advise and tutor all students living in any of our residence halls.

BEACHSIDE COLLEGE

Beachside is great for students who want the atmosphere, amenities and security of campus housing, but also want a chance to be slightly removed from the hustle and bustle of the main campus. Beachside consists of two buildings located on the corner of Pacific Coast Highway (PCH) and Clark Avenue. The buildings are a hybrid of traditional and suite style living. The rooms are situated along a long traditional style hallway and offer great two bedroom suite-style living with a shared bathroom. These air-conditioned, three-story buildings come with laundry and common areas. The residents of Beachside are able to utilize the other two CSULB campus dining halls and may participate in all RHA activities.

You will need to be admitted to CSULB in order to apply for housing. Please read the following information carefully and check directly with the Housing and Residential Life Office for additional information and important dates.

ROOM & BOARD


