CSULB's Building Infrastructure Leading to Diversity (BUILD) Program is one of 10 programs in the United States funded by the National Institutes of Health BUILD Initiative.

As part of our commitment to sustainability, CSULB has the largest solar power system on a CSU campus, providing 4.5 megawatts of energy from solar panels.

CSULB's Division I athletic teams surpassed the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate (APR) minimum score. The university has exceeded the minimum score for 14 consecutive years.
