Seiji Steimetz, Ph.D. is Associate Dean of the College of Liberal Arts at CSULB and Executive Director of the college's Office of Economic Research. Previously, Seiji served as Professor and Chair of Economics. His research specialties include transportation and urban and environmental economics, with emphases in applied econometrics and methodology. His work has been published in leading economics and interdisciplinary journals. Seiji currently serves on the Editorial Board of *Maritime Economics and Logistics*, and has served for over a decade as a researcher and executive committee member of the METRANS Transportation Center – a research partnership between CSULB and USC.

More recently, Seiji's work has focused on Scholarship of Engagement, including his contributions to developing the annual Long Beach Latino Economic Report and the Accelerate Long Beach economic forum series. He also served on Long Beach Mayor Rex Richardson's "100 Day Plan" transition team. Seiji's efforts to promote economic development in the region and improve the economic conditions of its traditionally underserved populations have earned him Centro CHA's Nuestra Imagen Excellence Award and Congressman Robert Garcia's Go Long Beach Award. His work in those areas is frequently covered in regional news outlets, including the Long Beach Business Journal, Long Beach Post, and Press-Telegram, and has been featured in national outlets, including the Washington Post and National Public Radio's Marketplace.

As a first-generation college student of color, supported by Federal Pell Grants and academic scholarships, Seiji is a proud product of California's community college and public university systems. He holds B.S. and M.A. degrees in Economics from San Jose State University and a Ph.D. in Economics from the University of California at Irvine.
