

IMPRO-VOZ

IMPRO-VOZ recorded a CD in the spring of '92 that also featured the CSULB Jazz Band I. All of the vocal jazz arrangements on the CD were written by either students or faculty of CSULB. IMPRO-VOZ was invited to perform for the International Association of Jazz Educators Convention in Washington, DC in 1991, and performed with the Long Beach Ballet in the spring of 1991. It was the international premier of a new ballet called, "The Unicorn" by a New York composer.

Michele Weir

Michele is currently a faculty member of the University of Southern California and California State University Long Beach. She was previously on the faculty of the Phil Mattson School and Spokane Falls Community College where she taught vocal jazz classes and jazz piano, harmony, improvisation and arranging. As a member of the vocal group, "Phil Mattson and the P.M. Singers," Michele appeared as singer and arranger for their two albums including Grammy nominated, "Night in the City."

As a pianist, Michele has toured as the accompanist for singer Bobby Vinton as well as doing free-lance work around the Los Angeles area. Michele's arrangements are published with Hal Leonard, Jensen Publications and the U.N.C. Jazz Press, and her commissioned works are performed by professional and educational groups internationally including "Chanticleer" and "Beachfront Property."

Michele is currently in demand as a clinician and adjudicator and serves as co-chair of Vocal Jazz for the International Association of Jazz Educators. Michele is also about to release a new CD as a soloist with Phil Mattson on piano.

Commercial Music Program, California State University, Long Beach

Since it's inception in 1974, the CSULB Commercial Music Program has developed a history of excellence, producing many successful musicians who have made significant contributions to the industry. The Commercial Music Ensembles have achieved local, national, and international recognition through numerous appearances at Jazz Festivals, Educational Conventions and Command Performances.

Some of the more notable performances include the Montreux Festival in Switzerland, the North Sea Jazz Festival in Holland, the Playboy Jazz Festival at the Hollywood Bowl, the Berkeley Jazz Festival, the International Association of Jazz Educators Conventions (IAJE), the Music Educators National Conference (MENC), the California Music Educators Association (CMEA), Disneyland, Dorothy Chandler Pavilion, the Long Beach Grand Prix, the Long Beach Amphitheater, and the Terrace Theater.

The ensembles have performed with such jazz notables as Bobby McFerrin, Rich Matteson, Bobby Bryant, Clare Fischer, Roy Burns, Ashley Alexander, Gary Foster, Eddie Daniels, Bobby Shew, Pete Christlieb, Flora Purim, Bill Holman, George Duke, Bill Hood, Tom Harrold, Airto, Ross Tompkins, Tommy Newsom, Doug McDonald, Joanie Summers, Ernie Andrews, Jack Sheldon, Les McCann, Guitar Shorty, Tommy Ferguson, Sunny Wilkinson, Bruce Brown, Don Shelton, Phil Mattson, Gerald Wilson, Billy Taylor, Pete Rugulo, Budd Shank, and Bill Watrous. They have also appeared by invitation as guest artists at Cal State Fresno, Cal State Northridge, UCLA, San Diego State, USC, The Stan Kenton 50 Year Celebration, and numerous appearances on major productions sponsored by KLON Jazz Radio FM88. They have also won top awards and highest honors at many competitive jazz festivals, including Fullerton, Chaffey, South Western, San Diego, Orange Coast, Berkeley, Western States, and Pacific Coast Festivals. CSULB Commercial Music students continue to receive numerous individual awards and honors.

The Commercial Music Program has prepared many students to enter the music industry over the past seventeen years.
