Leo Potts has built an international reputation for his creative and sensitive interpretations of music scores ranging from classical to popular music. In-volved in teaching, recording, and performing, he is Professor of Saxophone here at California State University, Long Beach, a founding member of the West Coast Saxophone Quartet, a Yamaha Performing Artist and Clinician, and the conductor of the C.S.U.L.B. Symphonic Band. Mr. Potts has received a degree in Music from C.S.U.L.B., studied under Marcel Mule and Daniel Deffayet at the National Conservatory of Music in Paris, and studied under Phil Sobel, a former NBC staff musician who is lauded for his creative concepts in saxophone teaching. Mr. Potts has just recorded a CD for Cambria Master Recording entitled Two Sides, which will be released in early 1995.
