with whom she performs in a piano duo. In 2011 she founded the duo AltoPiano with the violist Marion Leleu, who is especially dedicated to the performance of unknown masterpieces. Great attention was recently paid to the world's first recording of the *2nd Sonata for Viola and Piano* by the Hungarian composer Zóltan Gárdonyi.

Stephanie Hoernes has been teaching lied accompaniment / part-studies at the Musikhochschule "Hanns Eisler" Berlin since 2003 as well as string parade repetition at the HMT Rostock since 2014. Previously she taught piano at the HfM in Dresden from 2004-2010. In 2010, she was a jury member of the 3rd Solhi Al Wadi International Piano Competition in Damascus and was the director of the ensuing masterclass.
