


GRADUATION RATES FOR FRESHMEN STUDENTS






ADVISORY COMMITTEE GUIDING PRINCIPLES



GRADUATION INITIATIVE 2025 SYSTEM GOAL RANGES

Upon reviewing peer comparison data, considering the advisory committee's feedback, and taking into consideration the new campus "stretch" goals, the following goal preliminary ranges have been established:

Freshman 6-Year Rate	65% – 70%
Freshman 4-Year Rate	35% – 40%
Transfer 4-Year Rate	80% – 85%
Transfer 2-Year Rate	40% – 45%
Achievement Gap - URM	0 points
Achievement Gap - Pell	0 points



IMPACT



By reaching these ambitious goals, the CSU will become the <u>national flagship</u> for public comprehensive universities in terms of completion rates and equity.


The CSU will graduate almost 500,000 additional graduates, slightly exceeding the CSU's share of the state's projected need.

• Students from all backgrounds will graduate at similar rates.



4 - 4.5 YEAR FRESHMAN GRADUATION RATES

The 4.5-year graduation rate is consistently 6 to 8 percentage points higher than the 4-year rate.


Faculty Matter




