CALIFORNIA COLLEGES & UNIVERSITIES

California Community Colleges (CCC)

- · The CCC system is composed of 115 campuses.
- · Must be 18 years of age, a high school graduate or equivalent to attend.
- · CCC offers associate degrees and a wide range of program certificates.
- · Students may attend for two years then transfer to a college or university.

The California State University (CSU)

- · The CSU system has 23 campuses.
- · CSU usually admits the top third of high school graduates.
- · CSU is the largest four-year system of higher education in the nation.
- Each campus reflects its own personality, academic focus and strengths.
- CSU offers an applied hands-on education that prepares students for either graduate school or the job market.

The University of California (UC)

- The UC system has 10 campuses.
- UC usually admits the top 12.5 percent of high school graduates.
- · UC has nationally ranked academic and athletic programs.
- UC provides an education based in research and theory that prepares many students for graduate or advanced degree programs.

Association of Independent California Colleges & Universities (AICCU)

- The AICCU has 75 colleges and universities throughout the state.
- AICCU offers a number of different degree programs.

Costs vary depending on the school. Financial aid is available to qualifying students.
